21st Century Schools General Obligation Bond Preparing for Project Implementation

A promise made is a promise kept :

Local economic development

- Office of Economic Opportunity established by the School Board and Director appointed
- Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Goal Setting and Advisory committees in place with inaugural meetings in March, 2013
- Firm hired to complete disparity study to determine future level of participation in Bond funded projects by Minority/Women Business Enterprise firms (projected completion summer of 2013)



21st Century Schools General Obligation Bond Preparing for Project Implementation

- A promise made is a promise kept:
 Private sector participation
 - Greatly expanded list of architects, engineers and contractors to handle first wave of 65 projects with construction values between \$1 million and \$2 million (Year 1 of rollout)
 - Selected outside Program Management Services firm (Board approval received at May 8, 2013 Board meeting)

21st Century Schools General Obligation Bond District 6 Project Rollout Recap

- Total of 35 projects
- 21 to be implemented starting June 2013 through 2014-15
 - 20 include renovations (5 also include some building replacements) and a new 6-12 grade facility
 - Portable removal where needed and classroom technology included



21st Century Schools General Obligation Bond District 6 Project Rollout Recap

- 14 to be implemented starting 2015-16 through 2017-18
 - All include renovations (6 of those also include some building replacements) and 1 addition
 - Portable removal where needed and classroom technology included
- Technology enhancements at 3 (new/replacement) schools in last year of Bond rollout




