




Accelerated/Complimentary Scope Projects by Category As of November 24, 2021








Accelerated/Complimentary Scope Projects by Status As of November 24, 2021





Executive Summary

June 30, 2021 marks the end of the eighth reporting period and this report provides a high-level summary of the activities that occurred during the 2020-2021 fiscal year in the normal course of the GOB program's implementation. Project delivery continued uninterrupted despite the COVID-19 pandemic and the competition for labor and materials in a strong local construction market. The District's efforts to engage Small, Micro, Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise entities in project design and construction have been successful with increased program participation by the various groups.

It is noteworthy to acknowledge that the District is approaching the milestone of having expenditures and contracted services in the amount of \$986 million or 82% of the original \$1.2 billion bond amount. As projects are completed, remaining unused funds are being consolidated and reallocated to address prioritized needs throughout the District with the review and consent of the Bond Advisory Committee. Supplemental funding, are affording the opportunity to address newly identified deficiencies in the form of "Phase II" projects.

As in the prior reporting periods, limited scope projects were accelerated to address immediate needs, such as; HVAC improvements, exterior painting, playground replacements, roofing, portable removal/site restoration, and security enhancements, a critically important component of the overall program that has included replacements and upgrades of public address systems, perimeter fencing, signage and surveillance cameras centrally monitored in real time. Security enhancements have been partially funded by GOB projects and a combination of other funding sources.

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The Eighth Annual Report is a high-level summary of GO Bond related activities undertaken during the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 and was electronically disseminated prior to September 14, 2021.






