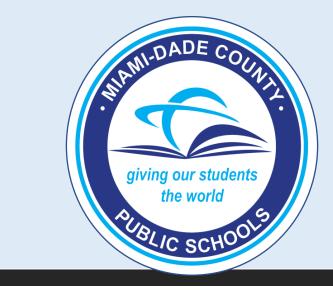

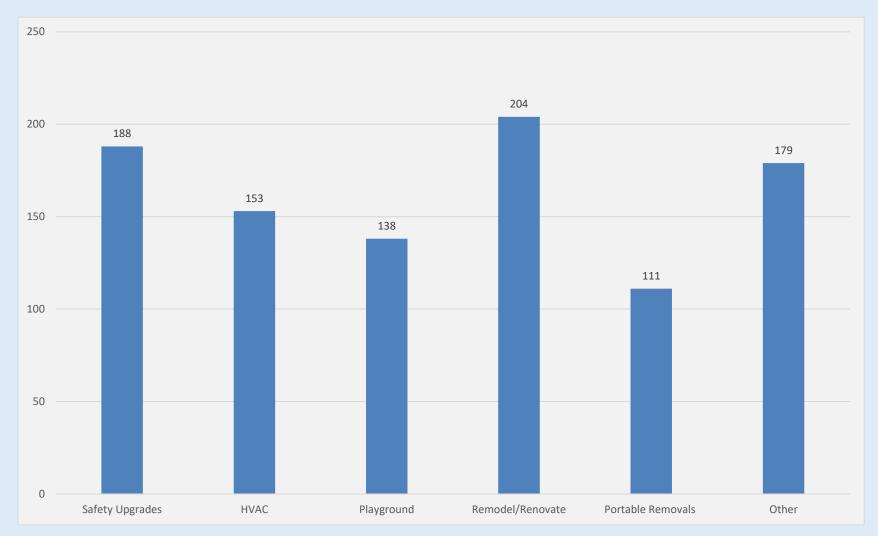

Accelerated/Complementary Scope Projects by Category As of June 1, 2023

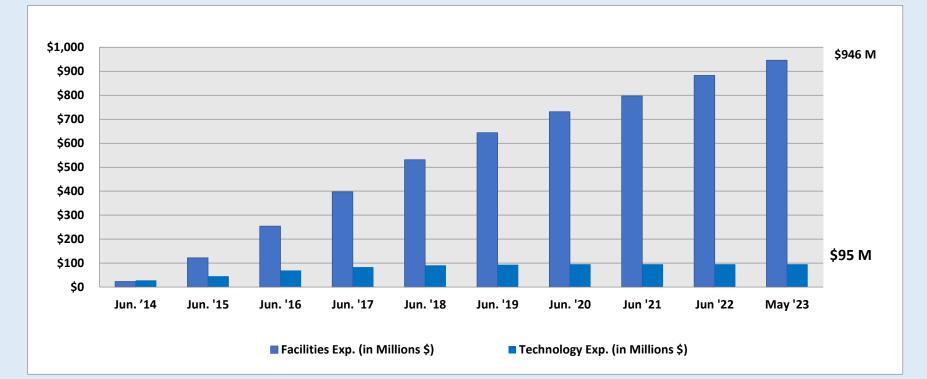

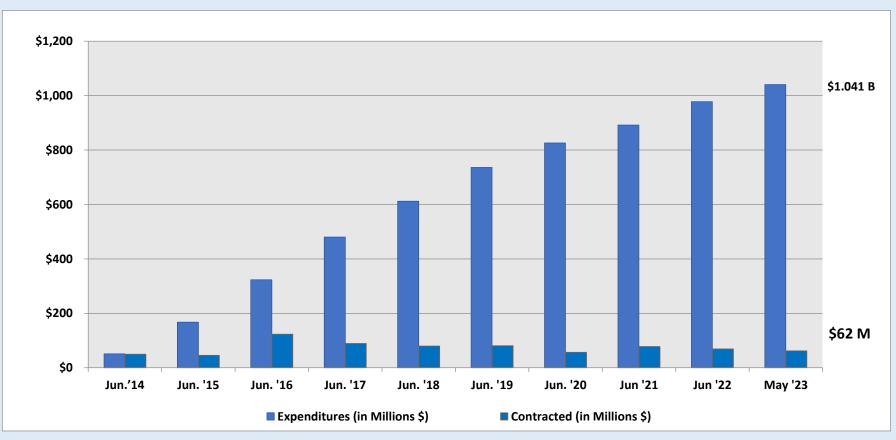

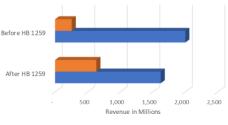


Capital Outlay Impact of HB 1259 (Scenario 1)

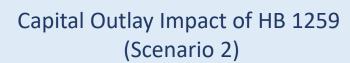

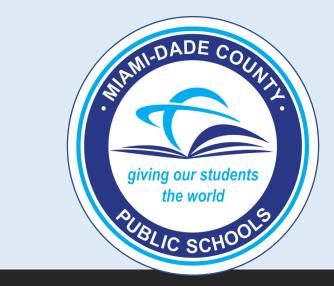

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Thomas Jefferson Biscayne Gardens K-8 Academy



\$11 million project. The scope of work includes a new 34,500 square foot, two-story building housing 554 student stations, with 10 primary and 17 intermediate classrooms, an entry plaza, P.E. shelter, covered walkways, parent drop off and hardcourts.

The \$13.9 million project featuring a new three-story, 38,000 square-foot building addition housing 625 permanent student stations, which includes 27 classrooms along with art and music suites, a media center, and administration offices.



Ruth K. Broad / Bay Harbor K-8 Center





This new educational building is a three-story, 45,000 SF building comprised of classrooms, labs, multimedia iPrep labs, and a ground-floor basketball court. The project scope included new tennis courts, a running track, and a synthetic turf field. The Town of Bay Harbor has an agreement with MDCPS to utilize the grounds for afterschool activities for the town including camps, nighttime movies on the lawn, and other public functions.

\$13.5 million - this project includes the construction of a new 34,500 sq-ft, two-story building addition including but not limited to include 10 primary classrooms, 17 intermediate classrooms, media center; and new covered walkways, entry plaza, parent drop-off, hardcourts, Physical Education shelter, and associated site and infrastructure improvements.

Phase I, K-5 portion of what will eventually grow to a full K-8, includes a 58,765square-foot, two-story school campus housing 750 student stations, with general classrooms, labs, media production lab, digital iTV, kitchen and dining areas, music lab and performance platform, administration area, parent and bus drop off, PE shelter, primary and Kindergarten play areas, and hardcourts.







\$44.2 Million 120,900 square feet of new construction to include administrative offices; student services; vocational labs, such as Web Design, drafting and design, health science, and business technology; new art wing, photo studio lab, gymnastics space, dance room, music room, and black box theater; new cafeteria building, technology labs, and an indoor and outdoor dining facility adjacent to a central courtyard. The remaining buildings will be remodeled and renovated to include exterior painting, new covered walkways between buildings, a new courtyard area, the replacement of existing vocational rooms and art suite; renovations of media center/CCTV suite, auditorium, music suite, ten science classrooms and laboratories, five computer labs, and support services; new hard courts, new central chiller plant; electrical and mechanical upgrades; classroom technology and miscellaneous upgrades throughout.
